Conditions of Entry

- Entries are open to people aged 16 or over, with a lived experience of mental illness.
- Youth section is open to High School aged artists, submissions are invited in all four categories as listed below.
- Each artist may submit up to one artwork in each category - Art, Sculpture, Textiles and Photography. Limit of 4 per artist. Please use a separate entry form for each artwork.
- Photography category is open to all forms of photography, more details will be available at www.bluefringearts.org and our Blue Fringe Arts Facebook site.
- The committee reserves the right to select entries suitable for exhibition.
- Each entry must have its own completed entry form attached to outside of bubble wrap
- Artwork must be the original work of the artist and not previously entered in Blue Fringe
- Art work must be suitably framed, ready to hang with D rings and wire attached - no wet paint, cardboard or paper backing.
- Artwork must be less than 1m x 1m if hanging, 1 metre in any direction and less than 15kg if sculpture
- Conditions of Entry If your work is for sale, price must be on entry form or clearly marked NFS (not for sale).

Blue Fringe Arts originated as the Adrienne Brown Awards in 1992.
